ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Regular attendance is the key to your child's success at school. Chronic absences make it difficult for students to learn the necessary skills to be successful, and they also put a lot of pressure on staff to support students who miss a significant amount of in-class learning. This year we are focusing on attendance, and our priority will be communicating with families about the importance of students consistently showing up each day. Our automated callout system is used to notify secondary parents each evening if a student has an unexcused absence. A reminder that if your child misses school due to illness or a family commitment, then a parent or guardian must contact the school to excuse the absence.



Visitor Sign-In

Parents and caregivers, please ensure you are checking in at the office when visiting SESS. All visitors to SESS are meant to sign in at the office prior to entering other parts of the school building. This is to ensure the safety of students and staff and to minimize distractions in the hallways and classrooms.
